

The Price of Freedom

The dictionaries definition of freedom is:-

Freedom:-

"The power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants."

"The power of self-determination attributed to the will; the quality of being independent of fate or necessity."

"The state of being unrestricted and able to move easily."

Friends, I would like to discuss in this letter, what is freedom and what has it cost? The dictionaries definition is above, but what does God have to say on the matter?

John 8:36 "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." Galatians 5:1 "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage."

I believe what God is saying here is we <u>are</u> free. We were <u>created</u> free, God <u>never</u> intended for us to be servants to anyone or anything. Adam and Eve were created free, they had the freedom to choose whether or not to believe the serpent. We are created free but born into sin, Jesus opened up a way to redeem us and He paid the price for forgiveness of our sins and bought our freedom. By His agonies on the cross He paved the way for us to be able to claim freedom via His blood.

Matthew 27:35 "And they crucified him, and parted his garments,..."

Matthew 27:50 "Jesus, when he had cried again with a loud voice, yielded up the ghost."

Matthew 28:5 "And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified."

Matthew 28:6 "He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay."

Let's move backwards along the timeline. Let's go back to when it all began.

Freedom in this instance cost a lot, the conscience of one state, one government, to protect moral laws and life led it to fight for personal freedom. This is but a example of the fight for freedom on earth. Everyone in God's planet has the right to freedom, but there are clauses. What if you have broken the law? the laws of the state judge you, and if they find you guilty punishment swiftly follows, you may even lose your freedom.
